Our American Veterans

Veterans Day (originally known as **Armistice Day**) is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11 to honor military veterans of the <u>United States Armed Forces</u> (who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable). Veterans Day coincides with other holidays, including <u>Armistice Day</u> and <u>Remembrance Day</u>, which are celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. At the urging of major U.S. veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day is distinct from <u>Memorial Day</u>, a U.S. public holiday in May. Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who had *died* while in military service. Another military holiday that also occurs in May, <u>Armed Forces Day</u>, honors those *currently serving* in the U.S. military. Additionally, <u>Women Veterans Day</u> is recognized by a growing number of U.S. states that specifically honor women who have served in the U.S. military.

The <u>Veterans Association of North County</u> invites the community to attend its Annual Veterans Day Ceremony on Friday, November 11 to honor the men and women who have served our country so bravely. The keynote speaker will be Lt. Gen George W. Smith Jr, Commanding General I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF), Camp Pendleton. Lunch will immediately follow the ceremony.


San Marcos High School

Chris Geldert's 1st Period Class at San Marcos High School is a beehive of activity on Wednesday mornings. He has thirty students in the Class. While most of his students are in the workshop working on individual projects, others are working outside building our second Warrior Village Project cottage and finishing the garden shed for the Agriculture Program that was framed by students in the Class of 2022.



The entire class comes together for hands-on instruction in the use of power woodworking tools. Chris teaches his students how to safely operate all of the tools and the techniques required to achieve the desired results. On this day, Chris demonstrated how to use the boring machine (horizontal drill press) and a router.

One of the advantages of building our cottage on campus is that our construction students have access to an incredible array of power tools a few steps away in their workshop. Tasks that would normally be done on a construction site with hand tools can be completed in a factory-like environment with more sophisticated tools.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

San Marcos High School

When we started building our first two cottages at <u>San Marcos High School (SMHS)</u> our intent was to do most of the construction work on campus. But, Covid came to town and our best laid plans were put to rest when we lost our student workforce. We transported our first house to a <u>Wounded Warrior Homes</u> residence in Vista when it was far from complete. We were able to complete the cottage on site in Vista with the help of volunteers, including professional contractors.

With a new cohort of construction students on campus, we are hoping to do much more of the construction of our second house at SMHS as we had originally planned. This month our students started preparing for the installation of the Hardie[®] Plank Lap Siding donated by Weyerhaeuser.





Our crew started wrapping the house with house wrap material provided by <u>Weyerhaeuser</u>. The 9' wide roll of house wrap was a perfect fit for our cottage.

After cutting around the windows and stapling the house wrap to the exterior sheathing the crew started marking the house wrap using a blue chalk snap line. They marked vertical lines indicating the location of the studs where they would nail the siding in place. They also snapped a horizontal line across the bottom of the wall to guide the installation of the siding pieces.

The bottom course of siding will be installed after the cottage has been set on its foundation to avoid damage during transit to the installation site.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE San Marcos High School (continued)

Students confirmed the locations of the studs and snapped blue chalk lines.



Using the James Hardie fiber cement trim boards donated by <u>Weyerhaeuser</u>, our students fabricated corner pieces for each corner of the house. The siding on each side of the house will 'die into' or 'butt up to" the corner pieces.



Our students are learning how to safely use a pneumatic nail gun under the watchful eye of AGC Apprenticeship Instructor Alan Jurgensen and teacher Chris Geldert.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

San Marcos High School (continued)

After confirming that the guide strip was positioned correctly on the chalk line and level, students started nailing the a course of siding to the house, checking and confirming that it was also level. Subsequent courses of siding will be installed up the side of the house with staggered butt joints.



While one team of students was installing siding, another team was in the workshop building wood window frames. They used a pocket-hole machine in the workshop to drill holes for screws in the back of the 4 frame pieces. After assembling the frames and positioning them around the windows, they took measurements to make sure that they hit studs when they attached them to the house with screws.



The first course of siding takes awhile to position correctly. But, after the first course is in place, the subsequent courses go up pretty quickly. The team uses clamp-on siding gauges to ensure that each course of siding overlaps the previous course by a consistent amount.

<u>The San Marcos Promise</u> (TSMP) is our fiscal sponsor for the Warrior Village Project at San Marcos High School. For this reason, TSMP established <u>Future Centers</u> at each high school in the San Marcos Unified School District. The Future Centers provide a focal point at each high school where students and their families have immediate access to post-high school preparation and planning resources. Their services are building confidence, opening doors, and helping students achieve self-sufficient futures. The goal is to help students choose, with intention, a path towards meaningful post-secondary training, education, and career opportunities.

Every student deserves to dream big about their future, but how do they dream big if they don't know what exists? In an effort to provide students exposure to the myriad of opportunities within today's workforce, the San Marcos Promise holds <u>Annual Future Fairs</u>. This amazing event draws 1000+ students and families each year! This year their Future Fair features a large in-person Exhibit Hall at San Marcos High School. DONATE TO THE WARRIOR VILLAGE PROJECT

We can provide <u>truly affordable</u>, permanent housing. But, we can't do it for free. To succeed, we need financial support. The materials required to build our cottages cost about \$60,000 per cottage (June 2022 estimate). It will cost about \$10,000 to transport a cottage to its installation site. The cost of installing a cottage as an Accessory Dwelling Unit will depend on the site. But, it should cost about \$30,000 per cottage. Hence, we can provide permanent housing for a veteran for about \$100,000 per unit (\$250/sq ft). This is a bargain compared to the cost of government supported 'affordable' housing projects. According to the <u>Terner Center for Housing Innovation</u> at UC Berkeley, in 2019 it cost an average of \$480,000 (\$700/sq ft) to build one unit of affordable housing in California under the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) program.
